Please remember to communicate with each other when someone needs emotional support. A member and family may need more than one phone call, inspirational message, or a card in the mail. If a request is made not to share the information, then please respect their wishes. Always ask your members if there is a brother or sister in need of encouragement at every meeting.

The Chaplain nurtures the members by spending time with them when needed and works closely with immediate family when a loved one passes.

The Chaplain is to perform the draping of the Charter and hold an annual District Memorial Service for the departed.

# Remember the Auxiliary Traditions - Podium Edition Bylaws and Rituals 2024

- -No member is allowed to enter the Auxiliary room during the opening and closing prayer.
- -No movement or noise when the Chaplain is opening and closing the Bible.
- -Draping of the Charter: The Charter to remain draped for a period of 30 days.
- -Memorial Service altar cloth to be one-yard square of white material with 6" purple boarder.
- -The opening and closing prayers in the Podium book are to be used only in your Auxiliary meetings.

## Honoring Gold Star Ritual for family, parents, and wives

-The members shall refrain from applauding during the ritual.

### **Memorial Services**

-Auxiliary may offer to hold a Memorial Service for a deceased member with members in attendance.

## Suggestions for oral prayer reading.

- -Speak slower than normal and speak clearly for effective oral reading of the prayers.
- -Speak to be heard
- -Enunciate for meaning and attention to the prayer.
- -Hold the prayer at eye level and do not look down.
- -Observe though and sentence units. Remember, punctuation marks are there for a reason. A period means pause and count to two. A comma means pause and count to one.
