Accredited representatives who assist veterans and their families.

Help with filing VA claims and accessing benefits.

Provide resources and support for various needs.

Key Benefits Assistance:

VA Disability Compensation

Financial support for service-connected disabilities.

VA Pension & Widows Pension

Financial assistance for eligible veterans and widows.

Aid & Attendance

Additional benefits for those needing personal care or assistance.

Health Care Benefits

Support for veteran healthcare services.

Other Federal, State, or County Benefits

Avenues for additional assistance outside VA services.

- When Meeting with Your Service Officer
- Bring as many of the following documents as possible to help prepare your claim:
- DD214 or separation papers (all service periods)
- Marriage certificate and any divorce decrees
- Birth records for each dependent child
- Service medical records (if available)
- Current medical records showing disability/diagnosis
- Medical records linking condition to active-duty service
- Death Certificates for Veterans or Dependents.

Veterans and Military Support

ADOPT A UNIT

- VFW Posts can "adopt" military units before, during & after deployments.
- Builds lasting, supportive relationships.
- Connects units to the full network of VFW resources.
- Service members & Family Readiness Groups can contact the MAP Office to participate.
- No reimbursements for events after closure.
- New funding will begin with the 2025–2026 program year.

VFW Military Appreciation Program (MAP)

- The VFW supports our troops day in and day out.
- Members provide:
 - Send-offs & welcome home events
 - BBQs, family support, deployment activities.
- Since 2005, MAP has sponsored events for 3.4+ million service members & families.
- MAP is the outstretched hand between local VFW Posts and the military community worldwide.



Veterans and Military Support

- VFW "Help A Hero" Scholarship
- Partnered with Student Veterans of America & Sport Clips
 Supporting veterans in reaching their educational goals.
- Scholarship Highlights:
 Up to \$5,000 per semester
- One award per family, per semester
- Covers tuition & fees only (paid directly to schools)
- Over \$13 million awarded since 2014 (if you want an impact stat here)
- Application Windows:

Fall semester: Jan 1 – Apr 30

(awarded in August)

Spring semester: Aug 1 – Nov 15

(awarded in January)

Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must:

- Be a U.S. citizen
- Be retired, honorably discharged, active duty, Guard or Reserve
- Have completed Basic + Advanced training
- Hold or separated at rank E-5 or below
- Show financial need
- Be accepted or enrolled in a VAapproved accredited program



Unmet Needs

Emergency Financial Assistance – Up to \$2,500

What It Is:

- Grants (not loans) to help military families through unexpected hardships.
- Funds are paid directly to creditors (not to the applicant).

Who Qualifies:

- Active duty, Guard, Reserve, or veterans facing hardship due to deployment, military pay issues, medical discharge, or service-connected injury/illness.
- Discharged prior to 9/11 veterans on fixed incomes with emergency hardship.



VFW Auxiliary Unmet Needs

What It Covers:

- Housing (rent, mortgage, repairs, insurance)
- Utilities & phone bills
- Vehicle expenses (payments, insurance, repairs)
- Food, clothing, childcare
- Medical expenses (prescriptions, eyeglasses patient's share)

What It Doesn't Cover:

Credit card debt, cable/internet, taxes, cosmetic procedures, luxury expenses.

How to Apply:

- Apply online at vfw.org/assistance/financial-grants
- Submit bills & documentation → Caseworker review → Payment sent directly to creditor.



VFW Mental Wellness Campaign





What Is 988 for Veterans?

Simple, memorable access: **Dial 988**, then **press 1**, to connect directly to the Veterans Crisis Line

Legal basis: The National Suicide Hotline Designation Act (signed in 2020) paved the way for 988 to become the official three-digit number for the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline

Activation date: All U.S. telephone providers were required to activate 988 by July 16, 2022

Why This Matters

Easier to remember: Just like 911 for emergencies, 988 simplifies access for mental health crises.

Veteran-specific routing: Upon dialing, pressing 1 connects you to trained responders who specialize in veterans' needs

Multiple access methods: Support is also available via text (838255) or online chat, providing flexibility for those seeking help

Suicide Prevention Community-Based Grant (WA)

Purpose: Supports peer-based suicide prevention services for Veterans and Families

- Funding Sources:
 - State legislature
 - License plate emblem revenues
 - Donations
- Uses:
 - Peer Corps support
 - Targeted mental health & transition assistance
 - Local community prevention projects
- Recent Opportunity: \$11K grants awarded in 2024 for innovative peer support programs
- Legal References: RCW 43.60A.270
- Eligibility includes non-profit community providers

- The Suicide Prevention
 Community-Based Services
 Grant funds local organizations
 that provide peer-to-peer
 support, wellness, and
 transition services for veterans,
 service members, and their
 families.
- Funded by the state, license plate revenues, and donations, this program expands the WDVA Peer Corps and supports community-driven suicide prevention projects across Washington.



VFW Foundation Grants

How to Apply for VFW Foundation Grants

Plan Your Project

- Ensure it fits one of the 3 grant categories (#StillServing, Post Assistance, or Uniting for Veterans).
- Contact the VFW Foundation before starting to confirm eligibility.

Complete the Application

- VFW Posts & Districts apply through the VFW Dashboard.
- Auxiliaries apply using the downloadable forms (available at vfw.org once the cycle opens).

Meet Minimum Requirements

- Minimum request is \$500.
- Each grant has its own limits (\$1,500 or \$2,500 depending on type).

Submit Proof of Project

- Grants are reimbursement-based you must complete the project first.
- Provide receipts, records, or donation confirmations with the application.

Deadlines

- Applications open Sept 2025.
- Close June 1, 2026 or earlier if funds run out.

- Combat Hunger campaign—they are indeed connected.
- The program was originally known as
 "Uniting to Combat Hunger &
 Homelessness (UTCH)", focused on
 addressing food insecurity and veteran
 homelessness through a matching
 donation grant of up to \$1,500

 - In August 2025, the VFW officially announced that UTCH has evolved and been renamed to "Uniting for Veterans", reflecting its broader mission to support veterans' needs beyond hunger and homelessness.



VFW Mental Wellness Campaign

1. The Challenge & Reach

20 veterans lost daily to suicide!

Reached 25,000 people with 200 Posts and 13,000 volunteers.

2. Strategic & Trusted Partners

Collaborations with Give an Hour, Campaign to Change Direction, One Mind, PatientsLikeMe, Elizabeth Dole Foundation

3. Know the Five Signs

Personality change, agitation, withdrawal, poor self-care, hopelessness.

4. Campaign Objectives

Change public stigma!

Train service officers & volunteers.

Provide community event templates.

Promote peer support, research, and legislative advocacy.



Department President Special Project

- Heroes Homestead
 <u>www.heroeshomestead.org</u>
- Mission: Support veterans and families in healing and thriving through mentorship, counseling, equine therapy, peer groups, and community events.
- Programs: Heroes Walk, Heroes Camp, Peer Groups, family support, and veteran outreach.
- Impact: Brings service members and veterans home in body, mind, and soul while addressing challenges like PTSD and transition.
- How to Help: Donations can be sent to the Department, earmarked for Heroes Homestead.



Purpose

Many donors prefer to give only to **501(c)(3) charities**. Since a VFW Auxiliary is a **501(c)(19)** nonprofit, this can be an issue.

The VFW Foundation acts as a fiscal agent (501(c)(3)) to accept contributions on behalf of Auxiliaries.

Key Points

Free service – no administrative or other charges deducted.

Minimum donation – must be \$100 or more.

Donors write checks payable to "VFW Foundation".

Funds are then directed to the designated Auxiliary.


Form Requirements Auxiliaries must provide:

Date, Auxiliary number, and President's name.

Contact information (phone, email, address).

Donor's name, address, phone.

Donation amount and purpose (if specified).







- Donations made to the VFW Foundation are not automatically passed through to an Auxiliary.
- To ensure funds reach the correct recipient, the Donation Assistance Form must be completed.
- This form provides the necessary information for the Foundation to properly direct contributions on behalf of the Auxiliary. Without it, donations may remain with the Foundation rather than being applied as intended.

DONATION ASSISTANCE FOR VFW AUXILIARIES

Many donors will only contribute to a 501(c)(3) charity. Since a VFW Auxiliary is a 501(c)(19) nonprofit this can sometimes be a problem. To help out, the VFW Foundation can serve as a 501(c)(3) fiscal agent by accepting contributions on behalf of your Auxiliary. This is a free service with no administrative or any other charges removed from the donation check. We only ask that any such donation is \$100 or more.
