This Citation is a wonderful way for auxiliaries to honor youth groups for their service to veterans, service members, and their families.

<u>Patriotic Youth Award:</u> This award is designed to recognize individual youth for their Patriotism and/or support.

<u>Reading Buddies:</u> Did you know any auxiliary member can be a "Reading Buddy"? All you need to do is sit and listen to a child read. Check with your local schools and libraries. You can use the book list in Malta and even donate a few books.

<u>Youth Acts of Kindness Certificates:</u> There are new certificates to use to show our youth that their good deeds do not go unnoticed. Those who go out of their way to be kind and helpful. Talk to your local schools and after school programs if they have students who stand out.

VFW Auxiliary Illustrating Art Contest: It is a patriotic art contest for elementary and middle school students in grades K-8th. It encourages artistic expression and creativity. It is fun to see how our youth of today view our world.

- Participants can win awards in various grade division
- Entries will be judged on patriotic themes and technique
- Contest will consist of three grade divisions: K-2, 3-5, and 6-8th
- Entries are due to <u>Auxiliaries by March 31st, 2026</u>
- <u>First place winner</u> from each grade division is due to me by <u>April 15th, 2026</u> (please plan accordingly- we DO NOT want students to miss out, they work very hard on their entries.)
- It is required to have the students name, age, and grade level to be written on the back of every art entry

I encourage your auxiliaries to use the youth groups to help promote this contest, if you are not working with a youth group this is a great opportunity.
