Any member can organize a new Auxiliary, as long as they are appointed as organizer by the Department President. Remember a VFW Post must vote by two-thirds (2/3) majority to have an Auxiliary.

When talking to a Post about having an Auxiliary, point out reasons that will help their Post. Here are some of them: They can assist in events in community/preparation, Buddy Poppy drives, bring in potential members, increases Program participation and positively reinforces the values and beliefs of the Veterans of Foreign Wars. We need to ask these bachelor posts. So let's take that first step. Remember be positive, friendly, enthusiastic and have the information they need to consider having an Auxiliary.

Please have your members answer the "Healthy Check-up for your Auxiliary Questionnaire" as this can help you to get to know your members better. Remember to send me a copy with a short summary of the answers to the questions. Never ever take any member for granted. The Good Job Award Certificate is a great way to show your appreciation for what they have done in your Auxiliary.
